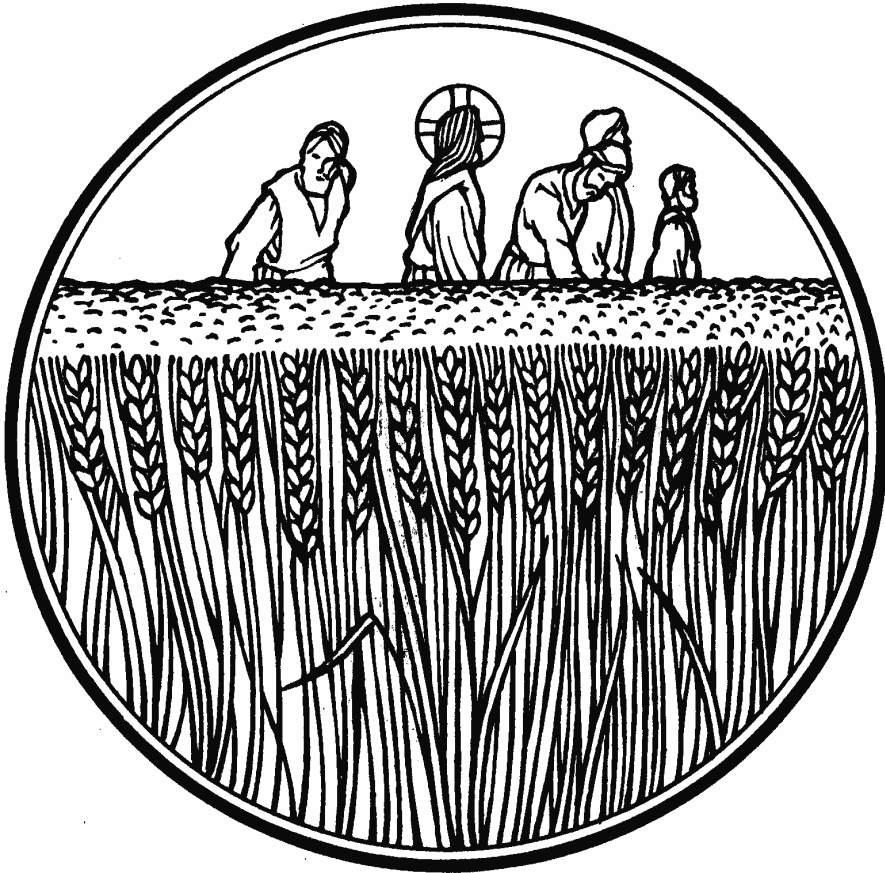

Communion Statement - The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are kindly asked first to speak with the pastor. In addition to this being our practice, we do not want our visitors to violate their own conscience or the public confession of faith that is made through their home Church membership. Those not receiving communion are invited to come forward with arms crossed to receive a blessing from the pastor. We thank you for respecting our practice. Below you will find a model you can use for your personal or family devotions that focuses you on the readings from the previous Sunday, while also preparing you for what you will hear the following Sunday. In modeling your devotions this way, you and your family can stay united to the church year and reinforce what you hear, sing, and pray every Sunday.

- Mon. 6/3:        Read the Old Testament lesson: Deuteronomy 5:12-15 – God gives us the Sabbath day so that we may rest and remember His mighty acts of salvation.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 906 – O Day of Rest and Gladness  
Pray the Collect of the Day: Eternal God, Your Son Jesus Christ is our true Sabbath rest. Help us to keep each day holy by receiving His Word of comfort that we may find our rest in Him, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.
- Tues. 6/4:       Read the Epistle lesson: 2 Corinthians 4:5-12 – God’s sent servants proclaim Jesus Christ, not themselves, so that His life may be seen in us.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 906 – O Day of Rest and Gladness  
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 6/3)
- Wed. 6/5:       Read the Gospel lesson: Mark 2:23-28 (3:1-6) – Jesus is the Lord of the Sabbath. Therefore, we see that the Sabbath is a gift for us, given by God so we may be fed and nourished by His Word for our salvation.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 906 – O Day of Rest and Gladness  
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 6/3)
- Thur. 6/6:       Read the Old Testament lesson: Genesis 3:8-15 – Right after the Fall of Adam and Eve, God gave them the promise of Christ: that the Seed of the woman would bruise the head of the serpent who brought sin and death.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 668 – Rise! To Arms! With Prayer Employ You  
Pray the Collect of the Day: Almighty and eternal God, Your Son Jesus triumphed over the prince of demons and freed us from bondage to sin. Help us to stand firm against every assault of Satan, and enable us always to do Your will; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Fri. 6/7:        Read the Epistle lesson: 2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1 – The troubles of this world are nothing compared to the glory of Christ which will be ours when He raises us from the dead to live with Him forever in a new creation.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 668 – Rise! To Arms! With Prayer Employ You  
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 6/6)
- Sat. 6/8:        Read the Gospel lesson: Mark 3:20-35 – In order to plunder us away from Satan, Christ first had to bind him up, which He did by His death and resurrection.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 668 – Rise! To Arms! With Prayer Employ You  
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 6/6)
