We will celebrate Holy Communion during our worship service this evening.

If you are partaking of the Lord's Supper, <u>please read and fill out one of the registration</u> <u>cards</u> on the back of the pew. You may place it in the offering plate or hand it to the usher.

Communion Statement - The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are kindly asked first to speak with the pastor. In addition to this being our practice, we do not want our visitors to violate their own conscience or the public confession of faith that is made through their home Church membership. Those not receiving communion are invited to come forward with arms crossed to receive a blessing from the pastor. We thank you for respecting our practice. 
The Words of Our Lord







Mon. 10/7: Read the Old Testament lesson: Genesis 2:18-25 – God established marriage before the fall, decreeing that a man and a woman should hold fast to one another and become one flesh with each other.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 863 – Our Father, by Whose Name

Pray the Collect of the Day: Merciful Father, Your patience and loving-kindness toward us have no end. Grant that by Your Holy Spirit we may always think and do those things that are pleasing in Your sight; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Tues. 10/8: Read the Epistle lesson: Hebrews 2:1-13 (14-18) – Jesus did not become an angel, but a man and He was crowned with glory and honor because He partook of suffering and death to save man.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 863 – Our Father, by Whose Name Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 10/7)

Wed. 10/9: Read the Gospel lesson: Mark 10:2-16 – Divorce only exists because of sin. Far greater is that a man and woman remain joined together, not separating by human means what God Himself has joined together in a one flesh union.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 863 – Our Father, by Whose Name Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 10/7)

Thur. 10/10: Read the Old Testament lesson: Amos 5:6-7, 10-15 – Seek the Lord, not your own works or strength, and He will be gracious to you and give you life.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 694 – Thee Will I Love, My Strength, My Tower Pray the Collect of the Day: Lord Jesus Christ, whose grace always precedes and follows us, help us to forsake all trust in earthly gain and to find in You our heavenly treasure; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever, Amen.

Fri. 10/11: Read the Epistle lesson: Hebrews 3:12-19 – Take care that you don't fall into unbelief, for those in unbelief have no share in Christ.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 694 – Thee Will I Love, My Strength, My Tower Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 10/10)

Sat. 10/12: Read the Gospel lesson: Mark 10:17-22 – Jesus is God and to inherit His eternal life, we must forsake the things of this world and cling to Him in faith.
