


MEMBERS AND GUESTS:

We will celebrate Holy Communion during our worship service this evening.

If you are partaking of the Lord's Supper, <u>please read and fill out one of the registration</u> <u>cards</u> on the back of the pew. You may place it in the offering plate or hand it to the usher.

Communion Statement - The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are kindly asked first to speak with the pastor. In addition to this being our practice, we do not want our visitors to violate their own conscience or the public confession of faith that is made through their home Church membership. Those not receiving communion are invited to come forward with arms crossed to receive a blessing from the pastor. We thank you for respecting our practice. 



He suffered and was buried.


And the third day He rose again according to the Scriptures and ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of the Father.

Mon. 10/21: Read the Old Testament lesson: Ecclesiastes 5:10-20 – The love of money is vanity. God would have us use our money in this life since we will take nothing with us when we return to the Lord.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 690 – Hope of the World

Pray the Collect of the Day: O God, Your divine wisdom sets in order all things in heaven and on earth. Put away from us all things hurtful and give us those things that are beneficial for us; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and

reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Tues. 10/22: Read the Epistle lesson: Hebrews 4:1-13 (14-16) – Jesus Christ is our Sabbath rest and in Him we rest from the need to work to save ourselves since He is our great High Priest.

Wed. 10/23: Read the Gospel lesson: Mark 10:23-31 – Salvation is impossible on our own, but not with God. He alone saves us and gives us eternal life.
