Communion Statement - The Lord’s Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord’s body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are kindly asked first to speak with the pastor. In addition to this being our practice, we do not want our visitors to violate their own conscience or the public confession of faith that is made through their home Church membership. Those not receiving communion are invited to come forward with arms crossed to receive a blessing from the pastor. We thank you for respecting our practice. Below you will find a model you can use for your personal or family devotions that focuses you on the readings from the previous Sunday, while also preparing you for what you will hear the following Sunday. In modeling your devotions this way, you and your family can stay united to the church year and reinforce what you hear, sing, and pray every Sunday.

- Mon. 11/11: Read the Old Testament lesson: 1 Kings 17:8-16 – God provides for the widow, her son, and Elijah by giving them their daily bread through and according to His Word.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 738 – Lord of All Hopefulness  
Pray the Collect of the Day: Almighty and ever-living God, You have given exceedingly great and precious promises to those who trust in You. Grant us so firmly to believe in Your Son Jesus that our faith may never be found wanting; through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.
- Tues. 11/12: Read the Epistle lesson: Hebrews 9:24-28 – Christ has dealt with our sin once and for all through His suffering and death, so we look for His return as He brings salvation.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 738 – Lord of All Hopefulness  
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 11/11)
- Wed. 11/13: Read the Gospel lesson: Mark 12:38-44 – The widow and her offering shows the true joy and generosity which comes through faith in Jesus Christ.

Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 11/11)
- Thur. 11/14: Read the Old Testament lesson: Daniel 12:1-3 – All people will rise from the dead when Christ returns, with believers entering everlasting life and unbelievers going to shame and everlasting contempt.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 508 – The Day Is Surely Drawing Near  
Pray the Collect of the Day: O Lord, by Your bountiful goodness release us from the bonds of our sins, which by reason of our weakness we have brought upon ourselves, that we may stand firm until the day of our Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
- Fri. 11/15: Read the Epistle lesson: Hebrews 10:11-25 – The blood of Jesus is the sacrifice which gives us confidence to draw near to God since, by His death, we have forgiveness of our sins.

Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 11/14)
- Sat. 11/16: Read the Gospel lesson: Mark 13:1-13 – Before Christ returns, the Church will endure persecution and death. Do not be led astray when these things happen. Endure to the end knowing that Christ alone brings salvation.  
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 508 – The Day Is Surely Drawing Near
