Communion Statement - The Lord’s Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord’s body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are kindly asked first to speak with the pastor. In addition to this being our practice, we do not want our visitors to violate their own conscience or the public confession of faith that is made through their home Church membership. Those not receiving communion are invited to come forward with arms crossed to receive a blessing from the pastor. We thank you for respecting our practice. Below you will find a model you can use for your personal or family devotions that focuses you on the readings from the previous Sunday, while also preparing you for what you will hear the following Sunday. In modeling your devotions this way, you and your family can stay united to the church year and reinforce what you hear, sing, and pray every Sunday.

Mon. 2/10: Read the Old Testament lesson: Isaiah 6:1-8 (9-13) – Though Isaiah was a man of unclean lips, the Lord takes away his guilt and atones for his sin so Isaiah may go proclaim the Word of God which does the same for us.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 398 – Hail to the Lord’s Anointed

Pray the Collect of the Day: O Lord, keep Your family the Church continually in the true faith that, relying on the hope of Your heavenly grace, we may ever be defended by Your mighty power; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Tues. 2/11: Read the Epistle lesson: 1 Corinthians 14:12b-20 – We are called to be mature in our thinking, gladly hearing and learning the Word of God.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 398 – Hail to the Lord’s Anointed

Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 2/10)

Wed. 2/12: Read the Gospel lesson: Luke 5:1-11 – At the word of Christ, the disciples, though they were sinful men, were made into God’s servants, following Him in everything.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 398 – Hail to the Lord’s Anointed

Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 2/10)

Thur. 2/13: Read the Old Testament lesson: Jeremiah 17:5-8 – Blessed is the man who trusts in the Lord because the Lord will always care for him.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 394 – Songs of Thankfulness and Praise

Pray the Collect of the Day: O Lord, graciously hear the prayers of Your people that we who justly suffer the consequence of our sin may be mercifully delivered by Your goodness to the glory of Your name; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Fri. 2/14: Read the Epistle lesson: 1 Corinthians 15:(1-11) 12-20 – Christ’s resurrection is the assurance of our own resurrections. As He is raised, so too we will be raised.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 394 – Songs of Thankfulness and Praise

Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 2/13)

Sat. 2/15: Read the Gospel lesson: Luke 6:17-26 – Blessed are all who believe in the Son of Man. Your reward is great in heaven, where Christ has gone before you.

Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 394 – Songs of Thankfulness and Praise
