Communion Statement - The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are kindly asked first to speak with the pastor. In addition to this being our practice, we do not want our visitors to violate their own conscience or the public confession of faith that is made through their home Church membership. Those not receiving communion are invited to come forward with arms crossed to receive a blessing from the pastor. We thank you for respecting our practice. Below you will find a model you can use for your personal or family devotions that focuses you on the readings from the previous Sunday, while also preparing you for what you will hear the following Sunday. In modeling your devotions this way, you and your family can stay united to the church year and reinforce what you hear, sing, and pray every Sunday.

Mon. 3/3: Read the Old Testament lesson: Deuteronomy 34:1-12 – Before the great prophet Moses died, God showed him the promised land, revealing that God will always keep His promises.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 413 – O Wondrous Type! O Vision Fair
Pray the Collect of the Day: O God, in the glorious transfiguration of Your beloved Son You confirmed the mysteries of the faith by the testimony of Moses and Elijah. In the voice that came from the bright cloud You wonderfully foreshowed our adoption by grace. Mercifully make us co-heirs with the King in His glory and bring us to the fullness of our inheritance in heaven; through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Tues. 3/4: Read the Epistle lesson: Hebrews 3:1-6 – Because Jesus is God’s Son, He has greater glory than Moses or anyone else.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 413 – O Wondrous Type! O Vision Fair
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 3/3)

Wed. 3/5: Read the Gospel lesson: Luke 9:28-36 – The Transfiguration shows Christ’s glory and reveals that He is the Son of God, the Chosen One who would save His people.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 413 – O Wondrous Type! O Vision Fair
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 3/3)

Thur. 3/6: Read the Old Testament lesson: Deuteronomy 26:1-11 – We bring offerings to our God, not to earn something from Him, but because of everything He has given us and done for us.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 656 – A Mighty Fortress Is Our God
Pray the Collect of the Day: O Lord God, You led Your ancient people through the wilderness and brought them to the promised land. Guide the people of Your Church that following our Savior we may walk through the wilderness of this world toward the glory of the world to come; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Fri. 3/7: Read the Epistle lesson: Romans 10:8b-13 – We believe in Christ in our hearts and confess Him with our mouths, calling on the name of the Lord who saves us.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 656 – A Mighty Fortress Is Our God
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 3/6)

Sat. 3/8: Read the Gospel lesson: Luke 4:1-13 – Jesus withstands the temptations of the devil on our behalf, defeating the satanic foe with the Word of God.
Sing the Hymn of the Day: LSB 656 – A Mighty Fortress Is Our God
Pray the Collect of the Day: (see 3/6)
